AgeLine is the most comprehensive bibliographic database on the rapidly growing field of aging. With references from both academic and general publications, AgeLine contains indexes and abstracts of books, journals, research reports, consumer guides and book chapters. The references in AgeLine come from the gerontology collection of AARP's Research Information Center, as well as selected articles from 300 magazines and journals, research reports, and descriptions of videos. AgeLine is a valuable source of information for researchers, service providers, policymakers, care givers and the general public on topics such as government sponsored programs for elders, healthcare costs and settings, housing, demography, elder care, financial and retirement planning, self-help, and fitness. Updated bimonthly on Ovid and three times per year on SilverPlatter.
