


AutoAlert History Page

When you click the AutoAlert History icon on the Saved Searches Page, the AutoAlert History Page opens.

On this page, a log of actions (or *event types*) displays for the selected AutoAlert. Ovid provides information about the AutoAlert, including name of the database in which the AutoAlert was created and a date-and-time log of activities for the AutoAlert. Some of the more common AutoAlert event types that get logged include the following.

<i>Create</i>	Creation date of the AutoAlert, either from saving a new search as an AutoAlert or from copying an existing search into an AutoAlert.
<i>File Format Conversion</i>	Date on which file formats of Ovid AutoAlerts were converted to an updated format. Like the create event type, file format conversion is a one-time event.
<i>Edit</i>	Records every instance that you edit the AutoAlert.
<i>Suspend</i>	Records changes you make to the suspension status of the AutoAlert.
<i>Success</i>	Records every successful run of the AutoAlert, including zero results runs.
<i>Override</i>	Records successful runs of the AutoAlert to which you have applied a date range override.

In our example, details of the 2005-03-25 run with override indicate that results of the user-requested override were preserved. To access them, click the Saved Search Results link, and Ovid re-opens your current session in the database(s) in which the AutoAlert was created, displaying the records from the results on the Ovid Search Results Display.

	Clicking the Saved Set Results link on the AutoAlert (SDI) History Page changes the database of your session to that in which the AutoAlert was created and erases the search history of the previous database.

To return to the Saved Searches Page, click the Previous Page button.

	History logs apply to AutoAlerts only.
	When you make a copy of an AutoAlert, history entries from the original alert do not copy over to the history of the copy. However, in the create history event of the copy, the name of the original AutoAlert does display.
